The President is George L. Faull, Rel. D. Mr. Faull attended the following schools: Lexington Christian Bible College - Lexington, KY ('58-'60); St. Louis Christian College, Florissant, MO ('60-'61); and Midwestern School of Evangelism, Ottumwa, IA ('61-'62). From the latter institution he earned the Bachelor of Sacred Literature.

He then began new Churches from '62 to '66 in Massachusetts, Vermont, and Maine. He received his Bachelor of Theology in 1970 and his Master of Arts in Theology in 1972, both from Indiana Christian University of Indianapolis, IN, while preaching in Michigan City, Indiana.

Mr. Faull did further work at Cincinnati Bible Seminary - Cincinnati, OH, ('75-'76), and Huntington Christian Seminary - Huntington, IN ('78) which was transferred to Indiana Christian University - Indianapolis, IN to earn his Doctorate in Religion in 1981.

In addition, he has held ministries in Treaty, Woodburn, Ft. Wayne, and Peru, IN. In 2001 he began a new work at Grissom Air Force Base near Bunker Hill, IN. While preaching at Treaty, he founded Treaty Institute for Evangelism. It was a correspondence school that grew to 12,000 students in 4 years. It has since had over 80,000 students enroll. It is now called American Bible Academy in Joplin, MO. It is the largest correspondence school in the Christian Churches/Churches of Christ.

Brother Faull has had articles published in 15 religious journals. He is a frequent speaker at many Family Camps, Men's Retreats, and Revivals. He has preached in over 175 different Churches in Indiana alone and preached in 42 states. He has taught college courses in residence each year since 1969. Last year 270 different resident students attended the resident classes at Summit Theological Seminary.

CONCERNING OUR VICE PRESIDENT

Summit's Vice President is Terry A. Carter. Brother Carter attended the following schools: At Tri-State University he earned an Associate of Technology ('86); From Purdue University a Bachelor of Science ('89); From Summit Theological Seminary a Bachelor of Theology ('98), and a Master of Arts in Theology ('99); And from Purdue a Master of Science (2002).

Before entering the ministry, Brother Carter worked as a Software Engineer. He began working for a Fortune 500 Company. Later he traveled the world working on computer controlled machinery. Then he spent some time as a plant manager for a gold refinery. Finally he began his own computer consulting company.

Brother Carter has held ministries in Stryker, OH; Archbold, OH; Fort Wayne, IN; and Millington, MI. Brother Carter returned to Fort Wayne in 1998 to help begin Northside Church of Christ. In 2006, he became the Principle of Harlan Christian School in Harlan, IN, in addition to his work with Summit.

Brother Carter has had articles published in several religious journals. He has spoken at a number of Family Camps, Retreats, Clinics and Revivals.

Brother Carter taught at Purdue University in 2001, but his ministry demands prohibited his teaching in both Purdue and Summit schools.

FACTS YOU SHOULD KNOW:

- * Summit Theological Seminary is not accredited by any accrediting institution.
- * Only 10% of the degree program can be earned by Life's Experiences.
- * You may use a qualified instructor with our approval for a course in your program. He must hold a degree equal to the one you are pursuing.
- * Currently 100% of our instructors graduated from schools other than Summit Theological Seminary.
- * 95% of the faculty's highest degrees were received from regionally accredited schools.
- * We are not affiliated in any way with any other institution of higher learning.
- * Students who are seeking:
 - a) Ordination in mainline denominations
 - b) To become a chaplain in the Armed Services
 - c) To teach on college level in accredited institutions are not encouraged to enroll in our Graduate program because such institutions require accreditation.
- * Bible colleges accredited with AABC may not accept our Under-graduate credits because we are not accredited.

SUMMIT THEOLOGICAL SEMINARY

Summit Theological Seminary is an unaccredited school. By that we mean that there is not any accrediting association to which we have applied for accreditation. We state this from the outset so as to let that fact be clearly understood. We do not desire to mislead any of our prospective students into thinking we are accredited.

Summit Theological Seminary exists for the specific purpose of teaching the Bible, the Bible sciences, and related practical ministry courses. Though it is not confined to those who are ministers of the Gospel, it was established for the purpose of recruiting and educating men for the ministry. The school was also designed to help encourage located ministers to finish their degree program. It is also expected that we will be of service to those who wish to continue their education on a graduate level.

The degrees that are awarded from Summit Theological Seminary are only in Theology and Religion. Our degrees are not designed to have any value in the market place, but only in the Church and Her educational institutions.

Those seeking easily earned degrees need not apply. A degree from Summit Theological Seminary means that the administration believes the student has the education that the degree represents. Summit Theological Seminary will not accept credits from any school that is a “diploma mill.” On the other hand, we will not knowingly accept credits from fully accredited schools, should it be known that the credits represent course work that is humanistic. Education which leaves out God is not true education. A “diploma mill” degree is worse than no degree at all. It is dishonest and unjustified to grant a degree without the work it represents.

The School is Unique in Several Ways:

- ✓ **First**, it does not offer any liberal arts education. However, it does require a basic core of Liberal Arts for the Bachelor’s degree. These must be transferred from other schools that are recognized by our school.
- ✓ **Second**, it does not have either a music or athletic department. However, some such courses from other schools may be used as electives.
- ✓ **Third**, the school will not solicit money for its operation. The school will be funded by its tuition. Some unsolicited gifts may come from those who believe in what we are attempting to do. It is our belief that many share our desire to have a college level program with an emphasis on Bible.
- ✓ **Fourth**, it encourages the student to be teaching in some capacity while he is enrolled. We agree with Seneca who said, “Men learn while they teach.”
- ✓ **Fifth**, it is not necessary that the student take resident courses. Though some may take residence study, others may choose to learn by means of tapes, videos, and reading courses. Seminars are also offered for those who can attend. Francis Bacon said, “Reading maketh a full man, conference a ready man, and writing an exact man.”

Summit Theological Seminary does not exist to tell men “How the heavens go.” It is designed to prepare its students to tell men “How to go to Heaven.” It does not deal with the “Age of rocks,” it deals with the “Rock of Ages.” It does not strive to equip men in the “Ways of the evil world,” but in how to help men overcome the “Evil of the world’s way.”

In short, Summit Theological Seminary exists for one basic reason: We want men and women to be “Teaching God’s Word to God’s World.” Our degrees simply state that the student has seriously disciplined himself to prepare for the task. It is the most important task in the world!

WHAT IS AN EXTERNAL DEGREE?

According to **Bear's Guide to Non-Traditional College Degrees**, one established traditional college is closing its door forever at the rate of nearly one a week! Why? No doubt the answer lies partly in the great cost of doing business. However, there is also another reason. The American adult population has found another means of education, which is more practical and much less expensive. It is called "External Degree Program." **This program does not require attendance at a traditional college.**

According to the **Peterson's Guide, "Who Offers Part-time Degree Programs,"** there are 12,000,000 students in higher education. One-third of these students are over 24 years of age. The same guide also informs us that there are 3,000 accredited schools. Then we are given the names of 324 of these same schools that offer an external degree. **This means that over ten percent of the accredited colleges in the United States offer an external degree. The great majority of these are state colleges and universities.**

In light of these facts, we can see how remiss the Church has been in not offering bonafide education to adults through external, independent study. Summit Theological Seminary intends to correct this oversight.

The Bible, theology, education, religion, and Biblical counseling are subjects that can be learned by external methods. Unlike art, crafts, science, and vocational trade skills, these subjects lend themselves to this type of an educational approach. The reading of books, listening to taped lectures, and viewing videos and cassettes make these subjects easily grasped by the adult student. A thesis, dissertation, project, or original research demonstrates the student's comprehension and expertise.

External degree programs are not correspondence courses, though a few correspondence courses may be allowed to be used toward the degree. **There is a vast difference between correspondence courses and independent guided study.**

Correspondence courses, for the most part, are usually several lessons in length, requiring "fill-in-the-blank" type questions, a short term paper, and a final supervised exam. There are 68 fully accredited colleges that offer correspondence courses in dozens of fields. Summit Theological Seminary will make use of these schools in assigning courses to students in the area of Liberal Arts.

Independent study, on the other hand, requires the student to acquire a bibliography, independent research, assigned reading, viewing, and listening, as well as originality in producing projects that demonstrate competency in the chosen area of study.

Summit Theological Seminary will use professors who are experts in their field to lay out programs of self-study for the mature adult that will result in a practical, inexpensive learning experience. This should assure the Church in the future a "continuing educational program" that will make every Christian a more profound student of God's Word and world.

Summit Theological Seminary makes no attempt to be politically correct, but rather doctrinally true to the Scriptures.

TEN WAYS TO RECEIVE CREDITS TOWARD YOUR SUMMIT THEOLOGICAL SEMINARY DEGREE PROGRAM!

FIRST - Class Participation

This participation is in resident classes. The rule of thumb is 15 hours of classroom per semester hour. This does not include outside assignments.

SECOND - Seminar Attendance

Seminars conducted by the faculty require 12 hours of instruction per semester hour, plus the outside assignments made for the class by the faculty advisor. In some cases seminars offered by other colleges may also be used to fulfill the student's competency. Approval from the Academic Dean is needed before other schools' credits are granted toward a degree.

THIRD - Equivalency Exams

These exams will cover the field of study in which the student feels that he is already qualified. These are one to four hour exams. Three credit hours are awarded upon the successful completion of the exams. CLEP exams will also be accepted by the school in particular areas of study.

FOURTH - Life's Experience

The credit granted for life's experience will be based upon the amount of experience the student has had in a field of study. These must be supported by credentials and will be included in your portfolio. The number of hours are limited to 10% of the degree's requirements.

FIFTH - Correspondence Courses

Credits will be accepted from sources recognized by this school. Summit Theological Seminary will recommend Liberal Arts courses from one of the 64 fully accredited schools that offer correspondence courses for credit.

SIXTH - Travel

The school will grant up to 6 credit hours for those who submit an acceptable paper on their visit to Palestine under a Summit Theological Seminary approved instructor.

SEVENTH - Competency

This will be the major source of learning and requires that the student work with his faculty adviser in designing the learning program. This can be met by following a prescribed system of study or by taking classes from another institution of learning.

EIGHTH - Thesis or Dissertation

These may be required for the degree in which the student is enrolled. The school will not grant over 6 hours for either one of these research papers. These must be bound and approved before credit is granted.

NINTH - Internship

Students who desire to earn credit for internships must submit an application stating their desire to do so. Summit Theological Seminary will work with the leadership of the sponsoring Church in developing a constructive program for the student. Credits will be open and decided by a student adviser. Students must be recommended for an internship.

TENTH - Transfer

We accept credits earned from other schools that we recognize. Credits from "Diploma Mills" or Humanistic courses from accredited schools will not be accepted.

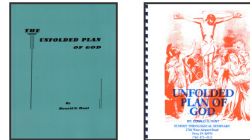
002 AN INTRODUCTORY PICTORIAL SURVEY OF THE BIBLE

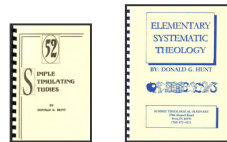
101 BIBLE DOCTRINE SURVEY

This is a survey of the Bible called, “**The Unfolded Plan of God**”. It includes a textbook and a workbook comprising of 52 lessons.



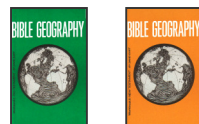
106 ELEMENTARY SYSTEMATIC THEOLOGY

This includes a textbook and a workbook called “**The 52 Simple Stimulating Studies**” and also makes up 52 lessons.



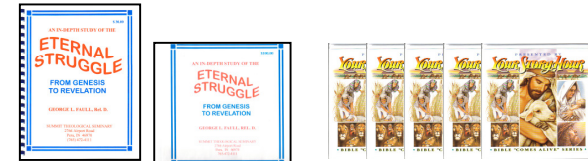
001 BIBLE GEOGRAPHY

This is a geographical survey of the Bible and consists of 26 lessons covered in two workbooks: O. T. and N. T.



117 BIBLE SURVEY

The Eternal Struggle is an In-Depth study of the scheme of redemption from **Genesis** to **Revelation** in 25 cassette tapes. This course shows the attempts of Satan to prevent Messiah’s coming to be the Savior of the world. No other seminary or college has this unique study. It has been over 30 years in the making. Also included will be 60 Professionally done **Bible Stories** on cassette tapes or CD’s.



003 13 COMPREHENSIVE BIBLE TESTS

These tests cover general Bible knowledge.

The total cost of this entire program of 135 lessons and 85 tapes, including registration fee (\$30.00) is \$850.00. **Neither the registration fee, nor the cost of the materials will be refunded if the applicant later drops out of the program.** This means that the student should not enter this program unless he is sure that he desires to complete it.

Each of these courses are available as individual courses, and if the student fears that he may not complete all six courses in this program, he should enroll in it, one course at a time. Students awarded the **Diploma of Biblical Studies** will be granted 16 undergraduate hours of college credit.

If the student chooses to pay in payments, this program will cost a total of \$850.00, plus shipping, unless the courses are taken one at a time (which will cost extra). If you audit this program, it will cost \$600.00. If you pay the bill in full initially, it will only cost you a total of \$800.00 plus shipping.

~ BIBLICALLY RELATED ~

- 101 Bible Doctrine Survey** – 3 hours
This course takes the student through elementary doctrine of both **Testaments**.
- 103 Hermeneutics** – 3 hours – The study of the interpretation of **Scriptures** relative to the figures of speech used in Scripture. The course helps the student interpret and harmonize difficult passages.
- 104 Bible Study Methods** – 3 hours – This course give sixteen different methods of Bible study that will prove useful to the student in studying the **Word of God**.
- 105 Biblical Introduction** – 4 hours – This is a study of the canon as to authorship, authenticity, preservation, authority, and reliability of the **Scriptures**.
- 115 Christian Ethics** – 3 hours – A survey on how to determine right from wrong by means of the voice within (conscience), the voice without (history) and the voice from above (revelation).
- 117 Bible Survey** – 3 hours – **The Eternal Struggle In-Depth** is an overview of the scheme of redemption from **Genesis** to **Revelation**. The course will show the attempts of Satan to prevent Messiah's coming to be the Savior of the world. No other seminary or college has this unique study. It has been over 30 years in the making.
- 118 Bible Customs** – 3 hours – This course deals with the peculiar customs and habits of life of those living in the **Bible** lands. These customs will make the **Bible** come alive for you.
- 127 Ruin and Redemption** – 3 hours – This course is an introductory course to the eternal battle between God and Satan.

~ BIBLICALLY RELATED ~

- 201 Archeology and Bible History** – 3 hours
This course will show the archeological finds, which either confirm or throw light on Bible passages. It will be studied in a chronological order with an emphasis on Bible geography.
- 324 Social Ethics** – 3 hours
This is a study of the social problems of today. They include drinking, Masonry, instrumental music, divorce, gambling, make-up, etc.
- 404 Typology** – 3 hours
This is a study of the major types in Scripture, and their value and usefulness. The dangers of carrying the types too far will be stressed and examples from Ante-Nicene Fathers and Jewish commentators will be given.
- 407 Old Testament Introduction** – 3 hours
This is a critical study designed to determine the date, authorship, and purpose of each Old Testament book. Special attention is given to preservation of text and its inclusion into the Canon.
- 412 New Testament Introduction** – 3 hours
This is a critical study designed to determine the date, authorship, and purpose of the New Testament book. Refutation of destructive critics is a major part of this course.

~ BIBLICAL TEXT ~

- 206 Genesis** – 3 hours
This is the book of beginnings, of firsts, which lays the groundwork for every other book in the Bible and answers many important Bible questions.
- * Creation verses evolution
 - * Beginnings of the scheme of redemption
 - * Patriarchs' life reviewed
 - * Theology of the patriarchs to Joseph
 - * Laws and customs of the period involved
- 207 Law** – 3 hours
Exodus through **Deuteronomy** is an in-depth study of the Law of Moses as God laid it down for His people. The wilderness journey will also be studied in detail, as well as the sins of the time.
- 208-A Joshua** – 3 hours
This gives in detail the possessing of the land of Canaan, its trials, its challenges and its victories. A contrast of Joshua and the Book of Acts will be noted.
- 208-B Judges/Ruth** – 3 hours
This will cover the customs of the times, and the six cycles consisting of "Sin, Suffering, Supplication, and Salvation" will be reviewed. **Ruth** will be studied for its typical significance. The lesson, "Not by might nor by power, but by My Spirit' saith the Lord," will be stressed.
- 209-A I Samuel** – 3 hours
This gives the rise and fall of King Saul, along with the beginning of King David's reign. This course will draw out many moral lessons applicable today with the main emphasis placed on leadership ability and their ability to lead men to or away from God. Also, the influence of the prophets will be seen.
- 209-B II Samuel** – 3 hours
This will challenge one with the strengths and weaknesses of King David and his son, King Solomon, and the ways these factors affected Israel.

~ BIBLICAL TEXT ~

- 209-C I & II Kings/I & II Chronicles** – 3 hours
When these books are harmonized:
- * They show the rise and fall of Israel as a nation.
 - * The affects each king and prophet had on Israel's spiritual well-being.
 - * It gives an overview of what was happening in the divided nation.
- 212 Why God Gave the Law** – 3 hours
This gives a clearer plan or understanding of why God gave the law. It clarifies why He gave the special requirements that He did, and the consequences if they were not carried out.
- 406-A Post Captivity Literature** – 3 hours
This period covers **Ezra, Nehemiah, and Esther**. **Ezra and Nehemiah** were two of those who returned from captivity, and **Esther** was one of those who remained in Babylon after the captivity. The faith and commitment of these three great personages will be shown by their accomplishments.
- 303-A Job** – 3 hours
This is the oldest book in the **Bible**. The problem of pain, and the theology of ancient men will be shown in this course. It bears out the importance of remaining faithful to God and why.
- 303-B Psalms** – 4 hours
This is a devotional book, which offers much spiritual strength to carry one through the daily struggles of life. This will show the Messianic prophecies.
- 303-C Solomon Literature** – 3 hours
This covers the Books of **Proverbs, Ecclesiastes, and Song of Solomon**.
- * These will be considered devotionally.
 - * **Proverbs** will be studied by subjects rather than verse by verse.
 - * The allegory of the **Song of Solomon** will be explored
 - * The perversion of the use of **Ecclesiastes** will be exposed.
 - * Internal evidence of inspiration helps to make these books of great value.

~ BIBLICAL TEXT ~

301-A Isaiah – 4 hours

This will be covered verse by verse:

- * Showing the times and situations of Isaiah's day.
- * Through this prophet's messianic prophecies, clear glimpses of the coming Savior are portrayed.
- * Problem passages will be handled.

301-B Jeremiah Literature – 3 hours

A verse by verse study of the “weeping prophet” covers the **Book of Jeremiah and Lamentations.**

301-C Ezekiel – 3 hours

This verse by verse study of the book covers the prophetic visions and the struggles of **Ezekiel.**

301-D Daniel – 3 hours

This covers the life of **Daniel.**

- * But even more exciting, the historical section of the book will show those being taken into Babylonian captivity.
- * The faith and dedication to the God of Israel is so powerfully witnessed in the life of this man.
- * His visions and interpreting of dreams present very interesting prophecies.

302 Minor Prophets – 4 hours

The books of **Hosea** through **Malachi** are covered in this study.

- * The historic setting will be noted for each of these twelve books.
- * The Messianic prophecies will be studied and no dogmatic position will be declared relative to the millennium.

126-A Life of Christ # 1 – 3 hours

This covers the early ministry of the Master.

126-B Life of Christ # 2 – 3 hours

This covers the middle time span of Christ's ministry.

~ BIBLICAL TEXT ~

126-C Life of Christ # 3 – 3 hours

It covers the conclusion of His ministry and His life here on earth.

126-D Life of Christ # 4 – The Parables of Jesus – 3 hours

This is a detailed study of each of the parables of Jesus with fresh insights. Many of the **Parables** do not teach what many previously understood.

126-E Life of Christ # 5 – The Miracles of Christ – 3 hours

This covers a detailed study of each of the miracles of Jesus.

126-F Life of Christ # 6 – The Claims of Jesus – 3 hours

Almost 2,000 years ago a man appeared on the pages of history. He made several claims about Himself that makes Him a unique person. In light of the fact:

- * We date our calendar from His birth.
- * We have national holidays in His honor.
- * His Church has endured the centuries.
- * More people meet to honor Him on any given Sunday than all sports activities in a year.
- * We need to decide if His claims are valid.

126-G Life of Christ # 7 – The Frustrations of Jesus – 1 hour

This course covers the frustrations:

- * Which Jesus Christ Himself went through.
- * That He struggled with.

He shows us how to handle them, how to live with them and that He is our Master Example.

126-H Life of Christ #8 - Matthew 24 Important Key to Understanding Bible Prophecy - 1 hour

This course covers the 24th chapter to explain the questions many ask about the End Times.

126-I Life of Christ #9 – The Servanthood of Jesus – 1 hour

This course gives a closer look at the Beatitudes and how each will show servant-hood more perfectly.

~ BIBLICAL TEXT ~

- 126-J Life of Christ #10 – Prophecies Jesus Made** – 2 hour
This course will surprise you and develops a theme that few have written upon. It is a study of the prophecies Jesus made Himself, not the prophecies He fulfilled.
- 128 The Life & Ministry of John the Baptist** – 1 hour
This course shows the ministry of John the Baptist
- 108 New Testament History** – 3 hours
This covers an in-depth study of the **Book of Acts**, chapter by chapter.
* Work of the ascended Christ by His Spirit is shown.
* A study of the conversions
* Concentration on Church government
* The zeal of the first Christians will be analyzed.
- 308-A Romans Chapters 1-8** – 3 hours
These chapters give a verse by verse study, as a part of the Pauline Literature, which will show the salvation by grace through faith apart from the works of the Law, but witnessed by the Law.
- 308-AB Romans Chapters 9-16** - 3 hours
These chapters give a verse by verse study as a part of the Pauline Literature, which will show the remaining studies of Romans.
- 309-A I Corinthians** – 3 hours
This book, in its verse by verse study, answer questions relevant to today, and will be studied from a practical standpoint. Such subjects discussed will be Denominationalism, Tongues, The Lord's Supper, Church cooperation, Women's place in the Church, Marriage, and Love.
- 309-B II Corinthians** – 3 hours
This is a verse by verse study of the book.
- 308-B Galatians** – 3 hours
This is a verse by verse study, which thoroughly covers the topic of **salvation by grace**.

~ BIBLICAL TEXT ~

- 310-A Ephesians** – 3 hours
This is a verse by verse study course.
- 310-B Philippians** – 3 hours
This will cover verse by verse the **Epistle of Joy**.
- 310-C Colossians** – 3 hours
This will be covered verse by verse.
- 311 Evangelist Epistles** – 3 hours
I & II Timothy and Titus were written to the evangelists, not pastor-elders. This will be studied to show a preacher's responsibility to those within and without the Church.
- 316 I & II Thessalonians** – 3 hours
This is a verse by verse study.
- 311 Hebrews** – 3 hours
It stresses the superiority of Christ to the Prophets, angels, Moses, Joshua, Aaron and his priesthood, etc. It also shows that there are better promises, covenants and hopes. This is a verse by verse study.
- 312 James and Jude** – 3 hours
This is a verse by verse study stressing:
* Righteous and holy living
* Faithfulness in life and doctrine
- 314-A I & II Peter** – 3 hours
This is a verse by verse study stressing:
* The living hope.
* Sure salvation.
- 313 Johannine Literature** – 3 hours
This covers **I, II and III John**. These epistles, contrasted to the the **Gospel of John**, will deal with: Love, Obedience, Knowing one's salvation, Dangers of false doctrine. These will all be studied in a verse by verse study.

~ BIBLICAL TEXT ~

- 403 Revelation** – 3 hours
The study of symbols, figures and signs, which appear in Old Testament prophecy, will be compared with those in **Revelation**.
- * The practical value of the book will be given.
 - * The victory of Christ over every foe, which comes against Him, will be stressed.
 - * All views will be considered.

~ PRACTICAL ~

- 109 Personal Evangelism** – 3 hours
This course will be instructing the student in how to win souls. Field study in residence work will be available.
- * How to approach
 - * How to create interest
 - * How to answer objections
 - * How to lead to a decision
- All these will be taught.
- 110 Homiletics** – 3 hours
This course covers how to prepare and deliver an oral address to men from God's Word. Topical and expository delivery will be emphasized.
- 119 How to Study the Bible** – 1 hour
This is a basic course on how to study the Bible. It is very helpful and plain.
- 227 Church Growth** – 1 hour
You Can Help Your Church Grow is an exciting study on how you fit into the program of the Church along with the leadership

~ EVIDENCES ~

- 111 Christian Evidences** – 3 hours
This is a specific study of the basis of **Christian faith**.
- 306 Apologetics** – 3 hours
A generic study of apology for "faith in the God of the **Bible**."
- 210 The Abused Texts** – 3 hours
This is a study showing texts that cause skeptics of the Bible to stumble, cause Christians to be perplexed, and that do not teach what we've always been told.

- 304 Church History II** – 4 hours
This course covers the Apostolic Age to the Restoration Movement. The course will summarize the history of:

 - * Dark Age
 - * The Protestant Reformation
- The Ante-Nicene Fathers will be considered closely.

Praying the Lord's Model Prayer and **Prayer Answered Guaranteed** will greatly strengthen your prayer life.

This covers the **Old Testament** Prophecies concerning the promised Messiah and their fulfillment in Jesus.

- 416 Greek II** – 6 hours of credit – This covers the **Prison Epistles** in the original language word by word so that new Greek facts are comprehended.

The majority of our students have been to other colleges before enrolling in Summit Theological Seminary. You may pay by **MasterCard, Visa, or Discover Card**. Please provide us your card account number, expiration date and name on the account. **If your Master's degree program is paid in full at enrollment, the \$250.00 graduation fee toward a degree will be waived.** This means that the Master's degree would cost \$1,800.00 if paid at enrollment, but \$2,050.00 (tuition) if paid in payments.

Students have one month in which to make a payment on the bills totaling over \$500.00 and a minimum of \$25.00 must be paid on bills totaling less than \$500.00. A service charge of \$10.00 a month will be added to the student's bill any month a payment is not made.

There is a 10% discount offered to those who pay their tuition in full upon enrollment. Your tuition or bill may be paid either by cash, check, or credit card (MasterCard, Visa or Discover Card).
